

Ontario Home Care Association commends government for measures to protect jobs for family caregivers

December 8, 2011 – The Ontario Home Care Association (OHCA) commends Minister of Labour Linda Jeffrey and Minister of Health and Long-term Care Deb Matthews for acting swiftly to introduce legislation in order to protect jobs for workers taking time off work to provide care for a family member. The proposed Family Caregiver Leave will give working Ontarians up to eight weeks of unpaid time away from work.

As a founding member of the Ontario Caregiver Coalition (OCC), the OHCA supports the introduction of measures that will support families as they fulfill caregiving responsibilities. With shifting demographics, family members will be called upon more frequently to support a loved one in a time of need. While most embrace the opportunity, the reality is that balancing employment and caregiving responsibilities can be challenging. Protected time away from work is one strategy that can effectively address the needs of families.

Family caregivers are integral to providing care in the home and today's announcement demonstrates that the Ontario government is aware of the challenges many families face. A strong formal home care system is also vitally important to sustaining those families with extraordinary caregiving demands.

The OHCA continues to encourage the government to sustain and increase the amount and flexibility of home care services and respite opportunities for families. This is critical to achieving health system transformation which is grounded in understanding the needs of individuals and tipping the balance of care provision in favour of the community so that Ontarians of all ages who are 'on the fringe' of admission to a facility can receive care and stay at home with confidence.
